CSLB Finds Online Trove of Unlicensed Contractors in Alameda County

Web search provides investigators plenty of leads for Union City sting operation; seven cited

SACRAMENTO – Investigators from the <u>Contractors State License Board</u> (CSLB) didn't have to look far to find suspected unlicensed contractors advertising their services in Union City. Two online publications, PennySaver and craigslist.org, provided investigators with more than enough leads, resulting in seven citations being issued for illegal contracting violations during an undercover sting operation on April 15, 2015.

Coordinated by CSLB's <u>Statewide Investigative Fraud Team</u> (SWIFT), the sting took place at a duplex in the east Bay Area community, with the help of the <u>Alameda County District Attorney's Office</u>. The online publications were packed with ads from unlicensed contractors offering services for the types of projects that typically cost more than \$500 in combined labor and material costs – the legal limit before a contractor license is required in California.

"There are many legitimate contractors who advertise their services using online publications," said CSLB Registrar Cindi A. Christenson. "Unfortunately, consumers must watch out on those sites for unlicensed contractors who are not qualified for the work skills they are advertising."

One tip-off to trouble is an ad that offers to perform an extensive project, such as a kitchen or bathroom remodel, that clearly will cost more than \$500 to complete, and requires expertise far beyond handymantype work.

At the Union City sting, the seven unlicensed individuals bid for landscaping, tile, and interior and exterior painting jobs. Bids ranged from \$2,500 for painting to \$5,500 for a re-tiling project that only included labor. None of the suspects had the contractor licenses needed to provide bids on such a scale, and they were cited for contracting without a license (<u>Business and Professions Code section 7028</u>). They also will face an additional charge of illegal advertising (<u>Business and Professions Code section 7027.1</u>).

In addition, one man was cited for requesting an excessive down payment to start work (<u>Business and Professions Code section 7159.5</u>). In California, a home improvement project down payment cannot exceed 10 percent of the contract total or \$1,000, whichever is less. Another suspect was cited for using a bogus contractor license number (<u>Business and Professions Code section 7027.3</u>), and not having workers' compensation insurance for an employee (<u>Labor Code section 3700.5</u>).

Suspects are required to appear on July 8, 2015, in Alameda County Superior Court, 22405 Amador Street, Dept.-512, Hayward, CA 94544. (MAP)
